

SECURITY AND THE PERALTA DISTRICTS



JUNE 23, 2020

SEARCH FOR ALTERNATIVE SECURITY VENDORS BEGINS. LEIGH SATA, FORMER VICE CHANCELLOR OF GENERAL SERVICES FOR PCCD, BEGINS ISSUING RFP'S FOR COMMUNITY-BASED UNARMED SECURITY FIRMS SHORTLY AFTER THE BOARD MEETING IN JUNE 2020.

DECEMBER 14 2020

PERALTA BOARD APPROVES \$6.2 MILLION CONTRACTS FOR THREE NEW SECURITY VENDORS.

ABSENCE OF REQUIRED PPO LICENSES: TWO OF THE PROPOSED SECURITY VENDORS (MARINA AND A1) HELD THESE LICENSES, THE OTHER TWO (CRC AND ZULU) APPARENTLY DID NOT.

JANUARY 5, 2021

MARINA SECURITY SERVICES, WHICH WOULD TAKE OVER THE SECURITY RESPONSIBILITIES FOR LANEY, MERRITT, AND COLLEGE OF ALAMEDA IN ADDITION TO ITS ORIGINAL DISPATCHING RESPONSIBILITIES.

MAY 6, 2021

DESPITE ASSURANCES FROM THE DISTRICT, CONFUSION STILL SURROUNDS THE CRC AND ZULU CONTRACTS

MAY 7, 2021

INTERIM CHANCELLOR JANNETT JACKSON ACKNOWLEDGED THAT CRC AND ZULU DID NOT HOLD THE REQUIRED LICENSES TO BE SECURITY VENDORS FOR PERALTA.

MOVING FORWARD

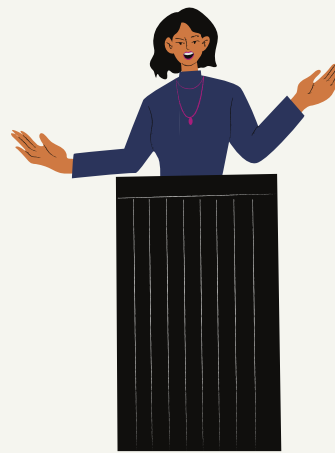
NEW RFP FOR SECURITY/SAFETY VENDORS WILL BE ISSUED ACCORDING TO MARK JOHNSON ONCE A NEW DIRECTOR OF SAFETY IS HIRED AND BROUGHT UP TO SPEED.

JUNE 22, 2020

DISTRICT DEVELOPS POTENTIAL HYBRID MODEL REDUCING TRADITIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AS BLACK MINDS MATTER PETITION TO TERMINATE CONTRACT WITH ALAMEDA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE CIRCULATES.

JUNE 23, 2020

THE BOARD VOTED UNANIMOUSLY TO END THEIR CONTACT WITH ACSO.



DECEMBER 31, 2020

THE DISTRICT ULTIMATELY DECIDED TO TERMINATE THE ACSO CONTRACT COMPLETELY.



JANUARY 7, 2021

MARK JOHNSON REVEALED THAT THE DISTRICT HIRED AN OUTSIDE SECURITY CONSULTANT, KNOWLEDGE SAVES LIVES (KSL), TO REVIEW THE "QUALIFICATIONS, EXPERIENCE, REGULATORY COMPLIANCE (AND) STRUCTURE" FOR CRC AND ZULU. KSL WOULD ULTIMATELY PLAY A LARGER ROLE WITH THE DISTRICT AND ITS PRESIDENT AND CEO, PAUL LLANEZ, WOULD BECOME THE ACTING DIRECTOR OF SAFETY.

JULY 30, 2021

INTERIM VICE CHANCELLOR ATHERIA SMITH ANNOUNCED THAT THE DISTRICT DECIDED TO WORK EXCLUSIVELY WITH MARINA.
